

Special Services

Autism Technical Assistance Services

All autism activities are available in full-day increments only. Time for services, preparation and follow-up must not exceed one day of purchased service. Access to the resource library and autism resources is included.

Facilitated team meetings: Spend focused, quality time in problem solving and planning for a specific student's needs. Decision making and action planning will occur.

On-site Collaboration: On-site observation and consultation with the local team can assist in providing a clear and concise roadmap to follow to provide improved services for students with autism. Access to the resource library and autism resources is included.

Autism Open House: Provide staff and parents with an opportunity to see what's new and what is available for students with autism. An Open House showcases curriculum materials, resource materials, videos, and a large collection of visual support samples. Attendees can network with an NIA team member, browse and check out books, or take photos of visual supports for use in the classroom, community, job site, or at home.

Autism Make-n-Take: This hands-on workshop provides a brief introduction to ASD and the use of visual supports for many learners. Attendees design and construct individualized visual supports such as daily schedules, work systems, social skill and academic supports. Limited access to Boardmaker may be provided depending on need. Districts will be responsible for providing needed materials, laminator, computer/internet access and one person to assist before, during and after the workshop. Access to the resource library and autism resources is included. Participants may want to bring a camera. This workshop is limited to 20 people at one time.
